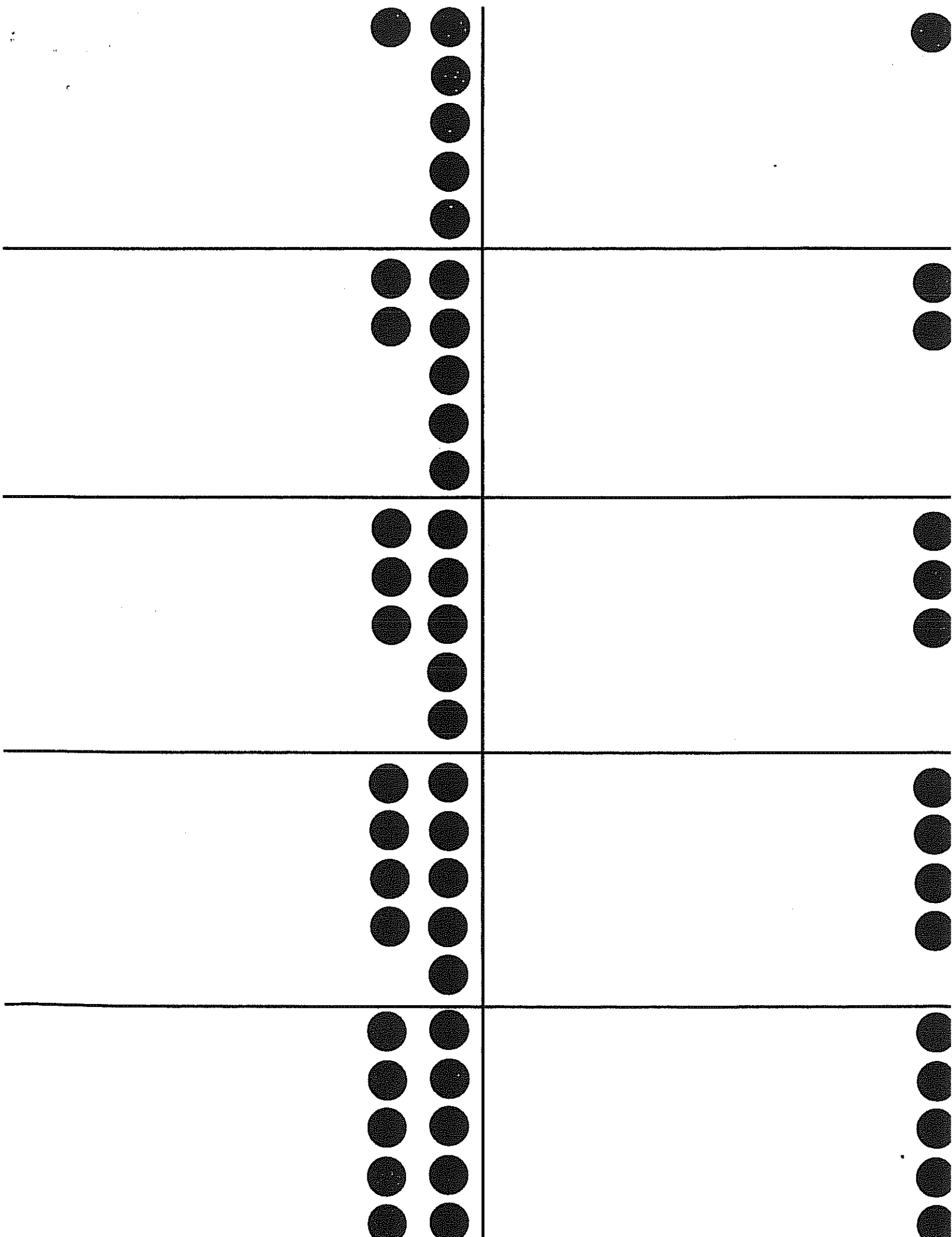


Dear Parents,

Your child is bringing home a set of number cards 1-10 and corresponding dot cards. These cards are part of our math curriculum. We use these on a regular basis. You can play 3 different games with these:

1. **Number Memory:** mix up the cards, lay down in rows, and take turns matching the number to the same number of dots. The winner has the most matches!
2. **Make A Number (easy version):** Use the number cards and you and your child work together to make a new number. For example: show your child how to make 29. Together you would use the 2 and 9. After you have made the number 29, talk about which is the tens and ones.
3. **Make A Number (hard version):** use the number cards to make a number. You call out a number then, your child would make the number. If you say 14, your child will pick 1 and 4. Next write out the number sentence $14 = 10 + 4$.



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
